On this occasion I would like to express my most sincere thanks to the members of the Board of Directors, the editorial board, and the advisory board for their continuous support.

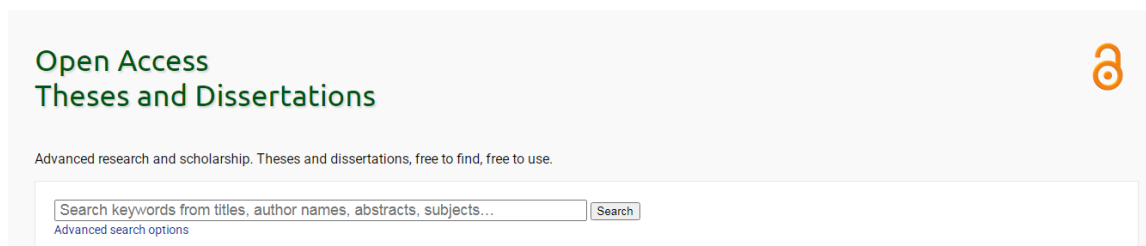

This website facilitates searching, as shown in Figure (1), in more than seven million theses; by keywords, titles, authors' names, research summary, or a specific topic.

- Second: *Microsoft Edge browser*: <https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/edge?form=MA13FJ>, which is a smarter, and more secure artificial intelligence powered browser for web content, prepared by Microsoft, which was released for the first time in 2015 as an alternative to Internet Explorer. Afterwards, it was developed in 2020 and supported by AI capabilities. This browser has many unique features.

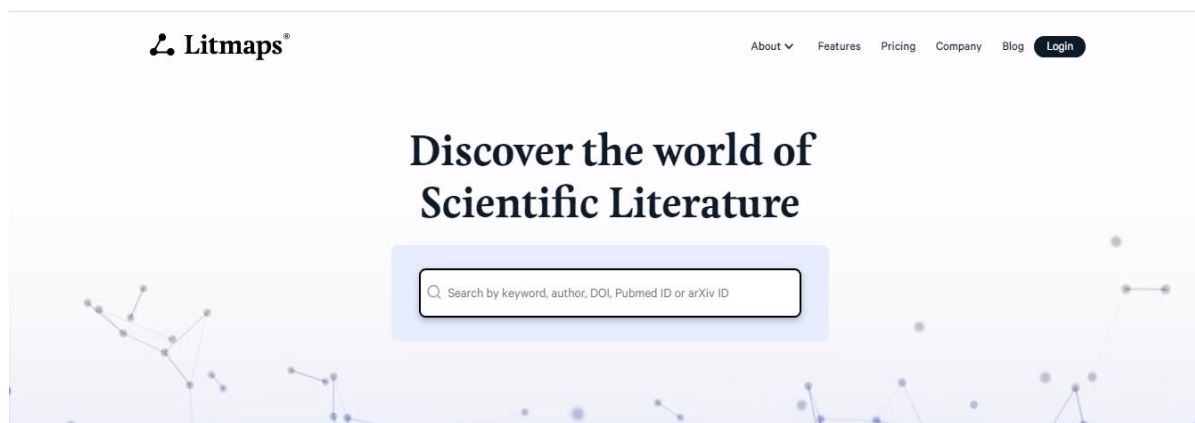

- Third: *Litmaps website*: <https://www.litmaps.com/>, Which provides an AI powered unique tool, that is distinguished by helping researchers review the Literature of the research topic through the following:

→ Providing an accurate and comprehensive scientific review of the research topic once the researcher enters the research topic in the research bar.

→ Presenting the scientific review in the form of a mind map, which helps discover research gaps.

This tool also uses clear algorithms and contributes to enhancing cooperation between researchers; see figure (2).



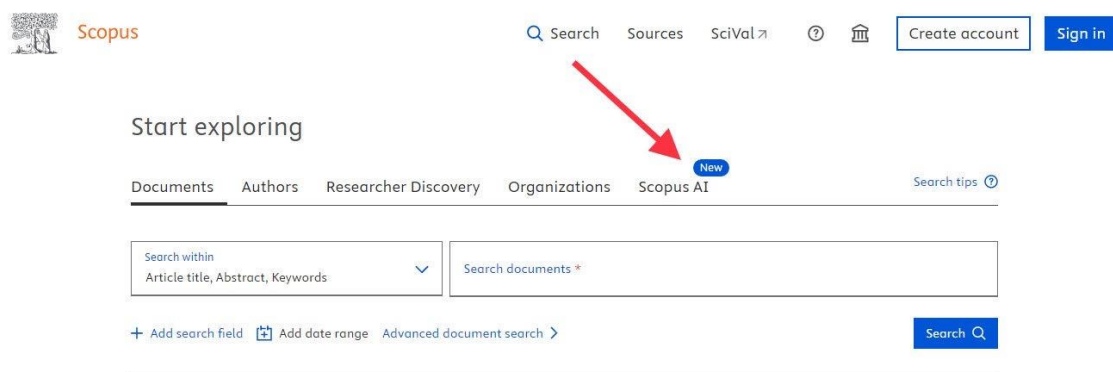

- Fourth: The *Scopus* AI research tool: It is a reliable AI powered tool, which was recently prepared and integrated into Elsevier's Scopus database, and designed to enhance research discovery, literature review, and academic insights.

Below is an overview of its key features:

1. Smart Literature Search: It uses natural language processing (NLP) to provide relevant research papers based on semantic queries rather than just keywords.
 2. Automated Summarization: It generates concise summaries of research articles, helping researchers quickly grasp key findings.
 3. Research Trend Analysis: It identifies emerging trends and influential papers in a given field.
 4. Citation and Collaboration Insights: It recommends potential collaborators and highlights highly cited works.
 5. Personalized Recommendations: It suggests relevant articles based on a user's search history and preferences.
- It is important to note that using this tool requires a paid subscription, but it can be used for free in Egypt by getting access through the Egyptian Knowledge Bank (via the "English Resources" icon), then "Scopus" icon, after that the screen shown in the following figure (No. 3) appears:
